

RFW Trophy Rules - Amended August 2017

In the event of a competition being discontinued the future use of that trophy shall be decided upon by the donors. If that donor is deceased the Club Committee will determine its future use

Road Race Trophy (Donated by Miss M Beadsworth & Mr M Taylor)

1. This trophy shall be for the competition during the whole of each racing season.
2. It shall be awarded to the rider scoring most points in road or circuit events under B.C. rules.
3. Points will only be awarded to a rider when they are representing Rockingham Forest Wheelers in an event. Points to be awarded as follows: 1st=10, 2nd=5, 3rd=4, 4th=3, 5th=2, 6th=1. Equal placing shall have the total points available shared among persons gaining equal placing.

Veterans Road Race Trophy LVRC

1. This trophy shall be for competition during the whole of each racing season.
2. It shall be awarded to the rider scoring the most points in road or circuit events open only to riders aged 40 or over under B.C. rules.
3. Points will only be awarded to riders representing Rockingham Forest Wheelers in an event. Points awarded will be: 1st=10, 2nd=5, 3rd=4, 4th=3, 5th=2, 6th=1. Equal placing shall have the total points available shared amongst persons gaining equal placing.

Chatellerault Trophy Overall Winner of the Seasons Time Trial Series

1. This trophy shall be awarded to the winner of the total points earned from all of the season's club time trials combined e.g. Spring, Summer and Devils events.
2. Points will be awarded as in the Club Time Trial series rules.
3. Points will be awarded to both 1st and 2nd claim members.

Senior Best All Rounder Trophy (Donated by Miss D Wallace and the late Mr M Cumberworth)

1. This trophy shall be awarded annually to the First Claim member of the Club who is the highest placed rider representing the Club in the Northampton & District Cycling Association Points Competition.
2. The trophy shall be perpetual.

Short Distance Best All Rounder

1. The competition shall be open to all * first claim members of the club.
2. The winner shall be the rider who is the highest placed rider representing the Club in the Northampton & District Short Distance Points Competition.

* This then allows Juveniles Juniors and Ladies to compete in the competition as well as Senior Men and Veterans.

RFW Trophy Rules - Amended August 2017

Ladies Best All Rounder Trophy (Donated by AC Chatellerault)

1. The winner shall be the First Claim Lady member of the Club who is the highest placed rider representing the Club in the Northampton & District Cycling Association Ladies Points Competition.

Junior Best All Rounder Trophy (Donated by the late Mr D E Roberts)

1. This trophy shall be awarded annually to the First Claim Junior member of the Club who is the highest placed rider representing the Club in the Northampton & District Cycling Association Junior Points Competition

2. This trophy shall be perpetual

Juvenile Best All Rounder Trophy (Donated by Mr & Mrs Hosier)

1. This trophy shall be awarded annually to the First Claim Juvenile member of the Club who is the highest placed rider representing the Club in the Northampton & District Cycling Association Juvenile Points Competition.

Brigholme Trophy – Cyclo Cross (Donated by Mr & Mrs E R Forscutt)

(Formerly the 12 hour trophy)

This trophy shall be awarded annually to the First Claim member of the club who has the highest overall placing in the Central Cyclo Cross points championship-senior category.

Veterans Cyclo Cross Trophy

This trophy shall be awarded annually to the First Claim member of the club who has the highest overall placing in the Central Cyclo cross points championship - Veterans over 40 Category.

Mountain Bike Trophy (Donated by Bob Mitchell Cycles)

This trophy shall be awarded annually to the first claim member who has gained the highest place in The Friday Night Mountain Bike series.

Adams Ladies 25 Trophy (Donated by Mr P Adams)

1. This trophy shall be for competition during the whole of each racing season.

2. It shall be awarded to the Lady member who records the fastest time in any open or Club 25-mile time trial when they are representing Rockingham Forest Wheelers.

Juvenile 10 Cup (Donated by Mr M Beaton)

1. This cup shall be awarded annually to the Juvenile First Claim member of the Club who records the fastest time for 10 miles in any open or Club time trial run in accordance with the rules and regulations of the CTT.

2. The ride must be completed before the rider's 16th birthday.

RFW Trophy Rules - Amended August 2017

Inter Club Trophy

(Donated by the late Mr A G Martin)

1. This trophy shall be for the annual competition between the Club and the Welland Valley Wheelers during a 25- mile time trial run jointly between the two Clubs.
2. It shall be awarded to the Club whose members score the highest number of points.
3. Points shall be awarded to the fastest ten first claim riders. 10 points for 1st down to 1 point for 10th.

The McLeod Challenge Cup

(Donated by the late Mr & Mrs J McLeod)

1. This trophy shall be for competition during the Inter-Club time trial with the Welland Valley Wheelers.
2. It shall be awarded to the Club member recording the fastest time in the event.

The Roberts Trophy

(Donated by the late Mr D E Roberts)

1. This trophy shall be for competition during the Inter-Club time trial with the Welland Valley Wheelers.
2. It shall be awarded to the first handicap winner in the event, who is a Club member.

The Eskdale Novice Trophy

(Donated by the late Mr & Mrs J McLeod)

1. This trophy shall be for competition during the last Club 25-mile time trial of the season.
2. It shall be awarded to the fastest novice in that event.
3. A novice for the purpose of this competition shall be any rider who has not taken a first, second or third prize in any open or association event under B.C. or C.T.T.rules.
4. The winner of this trophy shall not be eligible for the award in successive years.

The Ladies Novice Trophy

(Donated by the late Mr A G Martin)

1. This trophy shall be for competition during the last Club 25-mile time trial of the season.
2. It shall be awarded to the fastest Ladies novice in that event.
3. A novice for the purpose of this competition shall be any rider who has not taken a first, second or third prize in any open or association event under B.C. or C.T.T. rules.
4. The winner of this trophy shall not be eligible for the award in successive years.

The Fritz Hill Climb Trophy

(Donated by Mr A. Carlyle)

1. This trophy shall be for competition during the Club's annual hill climb.
2. It shall be awarded to the Club member recording the fastest time in the event.

RFW Trophy Rules - Amended August 2017

The Hugh Boyle Trophy (Donated by Mr. G. Hinxman)

1. This trophy shall be for the annual competition between the Club and Kettering Cycling Club during the hill climb run jointly by the two clubs.
2. It shall be awarded to the Club whose members score the highest number of points.
3. Points will be awarded to the fastest 20 riders- 20 points for 1st. down to 1 point for 20th place.

The Juvenile Hill Climb Cup (Donated by Mr M Beaton)

1. This trophy shall be for competition during the Club's annual hill climb.
2. It shall be awarded to the Juvenile First Claim member recording the fastest time in the event.
3. The rider should be under 16 years old when the event took place.

The Coronation Trophy (Donated by the late Mr J R Partridge and the late Mr D E Roberts)

1. This trophy shall be competed for annually and shall be open to all Club members of either sex.
2. The winner shall be the person obtaining the highest number of points in the Tourist Trial Competition.
3. If the club does not hold a Tourist Trial Competition in the year the winner shall be the club member who scores the highest number of points in the local N&DCA Tourist Trial event.
4. The competition shall test entrants in the various aspects of touring.
5. In no case shall speed be a deciding factor.

The Coronation Cup (Donated by Mr G Robinson)

1. This trophy shall be competed for annually and shall be open to all Club members of either sex.
2. The winner shall be the person obtaining the highest number of points in the Map Reading & Treasure Hunt.
3. The competition shall test the member in Map Reading combined with a Treasure Hunt. For the purpose of this competition, treasure shall be either material objects, answers to clues, or clues themselves.
4. If the club does not hold a Map Reading & Treasure Hunt event in the year the winner shall be the club member who scores the highest number of points in the local N&D. C. A Trail Quest for M.T.B. event
5. In no case shall speed be a deciding factor.

RFW Trophy Rules - Amended August 2017

The Merit Trophy

(Donated by the late Mr J S Scrimgeour)

1. This trophy shall be awarded annually for the merit of any act or service performed by any member or non member during the course of the life of the Club.
2. The annual season for the award of this trophy shall be from September of one year, to September of the following year.
3. Nominations for the award shall state, in writing, full details of the act or service, together with the sponsors' reasons for making the nomination.
4. The nominations, in a sealed and signed envelope, should be given to the General Secretary of the Club at any time during the course of the trophy's season, and he/she shall report to each meeting of the Committee, the number of nominations submitted.
5. Nominations shall close on the day prior to the September meeting of the Committee.
6. At the meeting the sealed envelopes shall be opened by the Chairman and the General Secretary, and they shall prepare ballot papers for all members present, showing a full list of the nominations received. The full nominations shall be read out to the Committee and without discussion, although points of information may be given. Each member present shall complete his/her ballot paper voting for ALL nominations in order of preference.
7. The nominations and the ballot papers shall then be placed in a sealed envelope and be forwarded to the donor or his representative.

Clubman of the Year Trophy

(Donated by the late Mr A G Martin)

1. This trophy shall be perpetual and shall be competed for annually.
2. The competition shall be open to all Male members of the Club.
3. The Club Committee at its meeting in September of each year will consider as to which male member shall be awarded the Trophy in respect of the previous twelve months. The decision of the committee is final.

Clubgirl of the Year Trophy

(Donated by the late Mrs E B Granger)

1. This trophy shall be perpetual and competed for annually.
2. The trophy shall be awarded to a Lady member of the Club.
3. The Club Committee at its meeting in September of each year will consider as to which female member shall be awarded the Trophy in respect of the previous twelve months. The decision of the committee is final.

RFW Trophy Rules - Amended August 2017

Club Time Trial Competition

Held on Club evenings during the season (Wednesdays)

1. There will be 5 categories for each Club Time Trial Competition. These will be:-
 - Overall (for ALL competitors)
 - Veteran (for riders aged 40 or over on 1st January)
 - Ladies (based on the CTT definition of a Lady Competitor)
 - Juniors (based on the CTT definition of a Junior Competitor)
 - Juveniles (based on the CTT definition of a Juvenile Competitor)
2. Points will be awarded to ALL club members (1st or 2nd claim) in each event as set out below.
 - Overall - 50 points to first placed rider, 49 points to second placed rider, 48 points to third placed rider etc. down to 1 point for the 50th placed rider.
 - Veterans - 30 points to first placed rider, 29 points to second placed rider, 28 points to third placed rider etc. down to 1 point for the 30th placed rider. Placing to be based on RTTC target times for each rider based on the riders age on 1st January of the year in which the competition takes place.
 - Ladies - 10 points to first placed rider, 9 points to second placed rider, 8 points to third placed rider etc. down to 1 point for the 10th placed rider.
 - Juniors - 10 points to first placed rider, 9 points to second placed rider, 8 points to third placed rider etc. down to 1 point for the 10th placed rider.
 - Juveniles - 10 points to first placed rider, 9 points to second placed rider, 8 points to third placed rider etc. down to 1 point for the 10th placed rider.
3. In each competition at least 50% of the possible events will count towards a rider's total. See table below:

Number of events in Series	Number of events that will count towards a riders total
3 or 4	2
5 or 6	3
7 or 8	4
9 or 10	5
11 or 12	6
13 or 14	7
15 or 16	8
17 or 18	9
19 or 20	10
21 or 22	11

4. By awarding highest points to the winners it will make interim tables easier to compile and easier to understand. (For example a table after 10 events of a season-long competition).
